“Take I. S. S. U. E.” is a community-based police initiative promoting responsible and safe Internet/electronic device use and cyber social interaction. The focus of this program is to provide awareness for parents, youths, and educational providers in order to highlight the various dangers associated with our rapidly developing technology. In doing so we strive to prevent the victimization of our youth and inspire healthy, responsible, and safe cyber habits.

The project was made possible through a grant from the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services. It was facilitated by senior officers of the Sault Ste. Marie Police Service and includes specialty members from the Technological Crime Unit and High School Liaison officers from the Investigation Services Division and the Community Services Bureau in conjunction with assistance from the Sault Ste. Marie Ontario Provincial Police’s Community Services Office. Both the Algoma District School Board and Huron-Superior Catholic District School Board have partnered with the police in this endeavour.

Addiction Effects

- **Social withdrawal**
- **Difficulty with face-to-face interpersonal communication**
- **Repetitive stress injuries(i.e. back, neck & carpal tunnel)**
- **Sleep deprivation (lack of concentration and depressed immune system)**
- **Poor physical conditioning includes obesity**
- **Possible increase of brain tumors with cell phone use**
